The Brooklyn Junction is the Brooklyn General Service newsletter. It contains service related articles and group, district, county and Area 49 announcements. I really think that the Brooklyn Junction is an important way to keep AA groups connected to other groups within Brooklyn and connected to Brooklyn General Service.

Our DCMC asked me to write an article on what this job entails. Prior to this position, I had absolutely no experience writing for or editing a newsletter or magazine. What I learned was that all you need is a computer, a document format (I used Microsoft Word) and a desire to be of service! You should also be relatively comfortable with the computer. I will be available to train the next person to hold this commitment, who will be appointed by our next DCMC. You do not have to re-invent the wheel! I want this transition to be as easy as possible for the County and the next editor.
